Brecksville is joined with the City of Cleveland in the case regarding SB 331 in Cuyahoga County. Assuming that State of Ohio will appeal, Director Matty will keep Council informed on the status of this case. Regarding the Building Department, the old law applies regarding that court case. The summary judgement reinstated the old law before it was changed last year. **LAW DIRECTOR**


