Purchasing Director Riser said last year's program awarded gold, silver and bronze awards.
Following feedback from the employees on how to improve the program, the awards of have
changed. The submissions were scored, weighted and tallied. From that process the top five
winners were identified. The award title was based on the content of the narrative that was
provided. The Mayor will introduce the winner and provide some information from the
narrative that was submitted.

The Brecksville Way: Purchasing Director Riser said the First award is titled the Brecksville
Way. The Brecksville Way was given for representing the City of Brecksville with the
utmost of integrity, displaying behavior worthy of emulation, bolstering the morale of others
and contributing solid and consistent devotion to the job and the City family with significant,
positive efforts behind the scenes.

Mayor Hruby said the Brecksville Way Award goes to Bonnie Longo. From the submitted
nomination Mayor Hruby provided the following: Everyone knows her and even if she is
passing along news you don't like, you gotta like Bonnie. If Bonnie ever had a bad day, I

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don't think any of us would know it. Knowing everything the Mayor does for residents, employees and anyone else that comes in contact with him, it is hard to believe that just one person could keep it all straight. The number of names, faces, phone numbers, e-mails, meetings, personal time, it seems overwhelming. Bonnie helped in many other ways, including the Children's Christmas Plays, Christmas Parade, Mayor's Inaugural Balls and countless others. **CONTINUED**

Mayor Hruby thanked Bonnie and congratulated her on the award and being recognized by her peers.

Salute to Bravery: Purchasing Director Riser said the Salute to Bravery award is given for displaying bravery and Courage in the performance of an official worthwhile act involving great personal risk which is far above and beyond one's normal job responsibilities.

Mayor Hruby said the Salute to Bravery award goes to Ken Septaric with the Police Department. Mayor Hruby provided information from the submitted nomination. Officer Septaric responded to the area of the S.R. 82 Bridge for what was initially reported as a vehicle stopped in the middle of the roadway. It was soon learned that a male had jumped from the bridge into the river. Officer Septaric quickly spotted the male's body in the river 30 feet from the west bank on the north side of the bridge. Officer Septaric rushed into the cold rushing water to check on the man's condition and render first aid, if needed. Officer Septaric reached the man, and stopped his body from being further swept down river by the current. Officer Septaric determined that the man was deceased and stayed with his body for almost an hour until Brecksville Fire Department personnel arrived on scene and were authorized by the Medical Examiner to remove the body.

Mayor Hruby thanked Officer Septaric and said by staying with the man's body and kept it from going further into the river, he preserved it, and allowed the family to provide a proper burial for the man.

Pursuit of Value: Purchasing Director Riser said the Pursuit of Value is given for significant accomplishments that directly contributed to the economy, efficiency or effectiveness of government, and resulted in cost savings, streamlined processes or enhanced services to the community and its residents.

Mayor Hruby said Mark Bender with the Fire Department is the recipient of this award. Mark volunteered to write the narratives for the grant applications for a FEMA Grant for Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus and fill station for the units. As a result of Mark's efforts, the City was awarded \$175,643.00 with a 5% cost match of \$8,782.00. The Fire Department was able to replace the 11 year old SCBA's with 20 new units, 20 masks, 20 voice amplifiers and (40) 45 minute bottles and a new fill station.

Mayor Hruby thanked Mark for his hard work in bringing that grant to the City and saving over \$175,000.00 for the city.

Making a Difference: Purchasing Director Riser said the Making a Difference Award is given for contributing in an outstanding way, every day, through exemplary work qualities, solving challenging problems, demonstrating the willingness to always go the extra mile and fostering the collaboration of others.

Mayor Hruby said Tony Graham with the Service Department is the recipient of this award. Tony has been with the City for 25 years when he was hired just out of HVAC school. The City had just completed the Community Center and needed someone that could oversee and maintain the equipment. Many changes have happened since Tony began with the City. He has married and now has a family. Tony has made it possible for the City to avoid hiring plumbers, electricians and HVAC technicians. He saves the City a tremendous amount of

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money. He provides excellent service and has trained himself and his skills are amazing. **CONTINUED**

in and help. He is very efficient and friendly. Tony makes all of the employees he works **AWARDS**
with feel important.

Mayor Hruby thanked Tony for the outstanding years of service.

Lifetime Achievement: Purchasing Director Riser said the Lifetime Achievement award was given for performing an outstanding service and accomplishment spanning a career at the City of Brecksville that reflected the values of the City, and enhanced services to the community and its residents.

Mayor Hruby said Donna Rees with the Police Department was recognized by the National Safety Town Center for her 45 years of involvement with the Safety Town Program in Brecksville. Donna has been involved with Brecksville Safety Town every year since its inception in 1972. "Miss Donna," as she is known to the children, began as a teenage volunteer and then became the Safety Town Teacher. What makes her 45 years of involvement with Safety Town even more remarkable is that she displays the same enthusiasm and excitement she displayed 45 years ago to the program every day. Donna has made a difference in children's lives, represented the City of Brecksville at the highest level and truly cared about the children and the program.

Mayor Hruby thanked Donna for all of the work she has done for Safety Town. Also for the excellence as a dispatcher, clerk and record keeper for the Police Department.

Purchasing Director Riser thanked Council for allowing time to recognize the nominees and winners of the 2017 P.E.E.R. Awards and Mayor Hruby for beginning this program.

Mayor Hruby recognized Purchasing Director Riser for all of the work she and all of the staff have done to put the program together.

Council President Skaljac congratulated all of the nominees and winners and thanked them for their hard work and dedication to the City.

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
