REPORT OF LAW DIRECTOR: Law Director Matty reported on August 31st the REPORT OF 8th Apellate, District Court of Appeals, Common Pleas Court affirmed the trial court's LAW decision upholding the ordinance on the tax credit reduction enacted in 2015. The judge DIRECTOR indicated that following case law that has been in place since 1951 by The Ohio Supreme Court and the City of Brecksville Charter, in which 4 members of Council control as a majority and did pass Ordinance 4890. That Ordinance stands in place since 2015 and will continue as to the time that it should expire as to the terms when it reaches a certain level of income tax. The Judge spent, it seems, many hours reading the briefs and writing a wellreasoned opinion. Law Director Matty thanked Council and the Mayor for their patience and

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support. Without action enacting the ordinance but allowing the law department to proceed, our community could not benefit from approximately \$900,000.00.
