

Low Income Snow Plowing for Seniors

The Human Services Center offers driveway snow plowing for low income seniors. The program is solely for low income seniors 70 and over who have no one to clear their driveway.

Proof of income is required and the only proof of income document acceptable is an official letter from the Ohio Development Services Agency indicating household eligibility for the 2020-2021 or 2021-2022 Home Energy Assistance Program, commonly referred to as HEAP, or PIPP, the Percentage of Income Payment Plan Plus. If you have never qualified for HEAP or PIPP before, it is advised that you apply immediately because it takes several months to get qualified. Proof of age is also required.

To qualify for HEAP, Total Gross Annual Household Income may not exceed \$22,330 for a single person household or \$30,170 for a two-person household. These numbers will probably increase in July of 2021.

To qualify for PIPP, Total Gross Annual Household Income may not exceed \$19,140 for a single person household or \$25,860 for a two-person household.

Applications are available at the Human Services Center.

Senior snowplowing is just \$10 for the entire season!

All residents who qualify must re-apply every year regardless of whether you have qualified in the past.

Some seniors have asked why the City does not plow all senior driveways. The answer is that the cost would be more than \$20,000 whenever it snows more than four inches.
