Valor Acres will now include the Dalad/Crowland Property. Below is the public notice of this hearing. Although due to the COVID19 distancing, limited seats are available in City Council Chambers. This legislation would provide for a 40 (c) TIF which funds are to be for public improvements only.

City Council will also consider legislation to submit to the electors of our city an initiative petition submitted by a special interest group, proposing Charter Amendments that would replace the current procedure on how the city voters elect their members of City Council. The current City Charter provides for the election of all seven members of City Council at Large. This proposal would revise the Charter to provide for a "Mapping designation" of Four (4) Wards, with one member of Council elected in each ward and Three (3) members to be elected at large. City Council is required by law to adopt this legislation and place the issue on the ballot for our voters to determine its outcome.
